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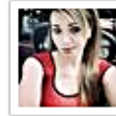


Diabetes & OSNs

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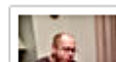

- Text
- “Likes” 
- Friends, Followers

2. How do patients interact with each other?


- Emotional, Informational, Structural Support
- Seeking, providing

3. How do these factors affect diabetes management?

- Study 2 underway

DiabeticConnect.com

- “Scrape” publicly available data
- 1000 randomly-selected posts
 - Username
 - Date/time
 - Text 
 - “Likes”
 - Main post
 - Comments
 - Responses
 - Friends, Followers

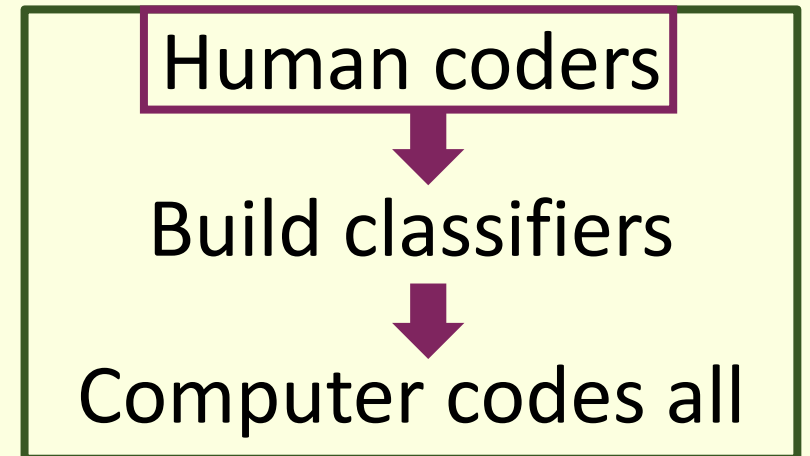

Method

DiabeticConnect.com

Support Coding:

- **Emotional:** emotion expression (seeking), seeks/provides validation or encouragement
- **Informational:** seeks/provides welcome advice or information
- **Structural:** seeks/provides inclusion or acceptance in network
- Inter-coder agreement (kappa): .39 - .77
- 4 coders, ≥ 3 “votes” \rightarrow 735/1000 posts



Providing Emotional Support: “Sorry you have this problem, and I do too.”

Seeking Emotional Support: “I am so stressed and disgusted with the 60 pounds that I have gained from just taking the medications to control the diabetes. I look like this fat pregnant telletubbie. I am so sad and do not know why it is hard for me to get back to normal size.”

Providing Informational Support: “Russell Stover Sugar Free Candy is fabulous but it’s not carbohydrate free...There is peanut butter cup flavor, heath bar flavor, almond joy and others. Cannot tell the difference between their sugar free and the real thing! Walgreens and Wal-Mart sell it.”

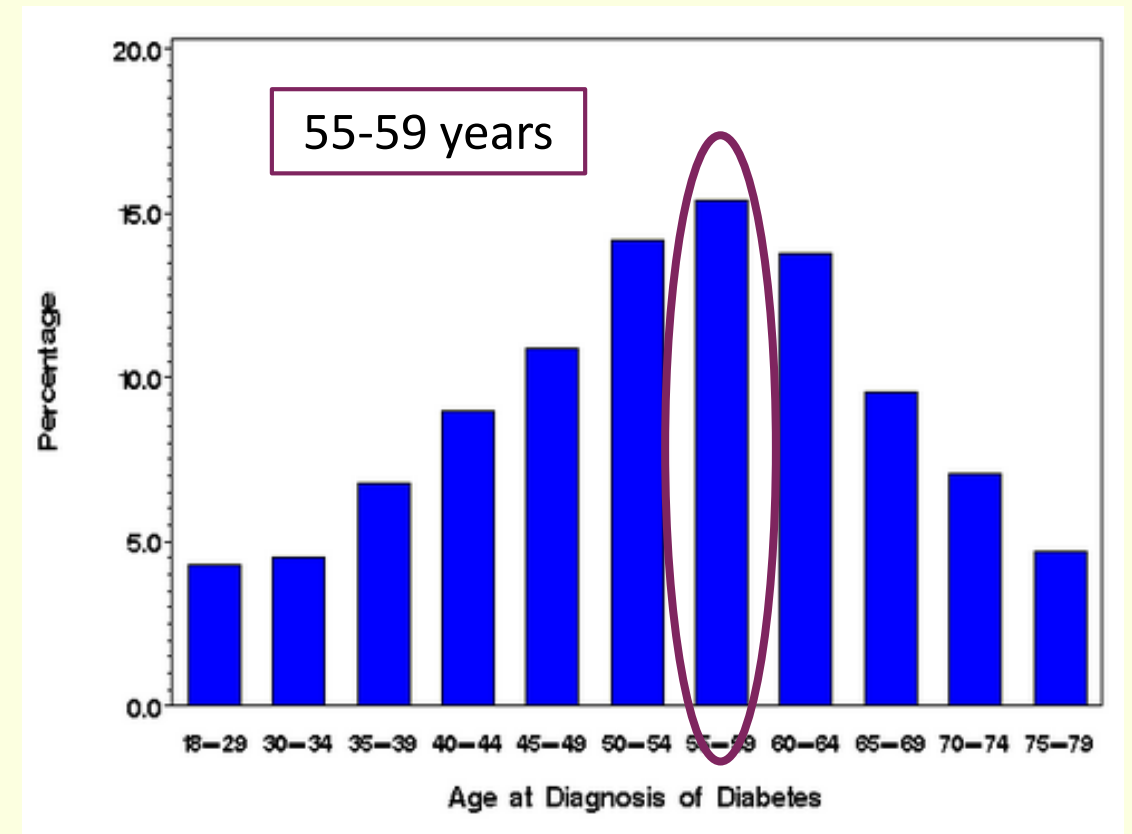
Seeking Informational Support: “We have been doing the fasting blood test, no glucose and I have been running a 140 and they said I am diabetic and put me on a pill I take when I eat... I am really confused and my Dr. does not have much bedside manner to explain. So what does it all mean?”

Providing Structural Support: “First of all, welcome to our website! I cannot say enough good things about this place and the incredible people I’ve met who have become real life friends as well as virtual.”

Seeking Structural Support: “Hello Everyone! I am new here and feel blessed to have found this site with such an abundance of information and support.”

DiabeticConnect Users

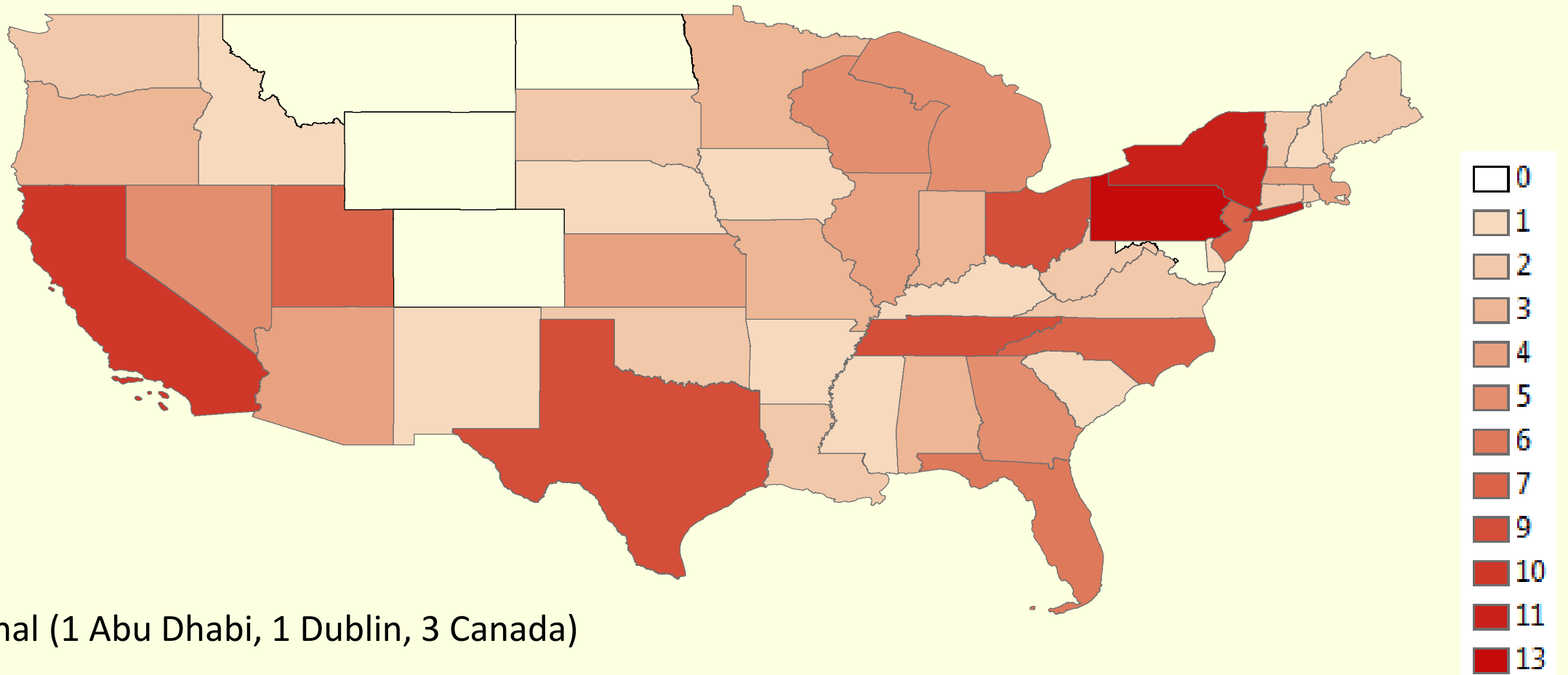
- 528 unique users

DiabeticConnect Users' Location

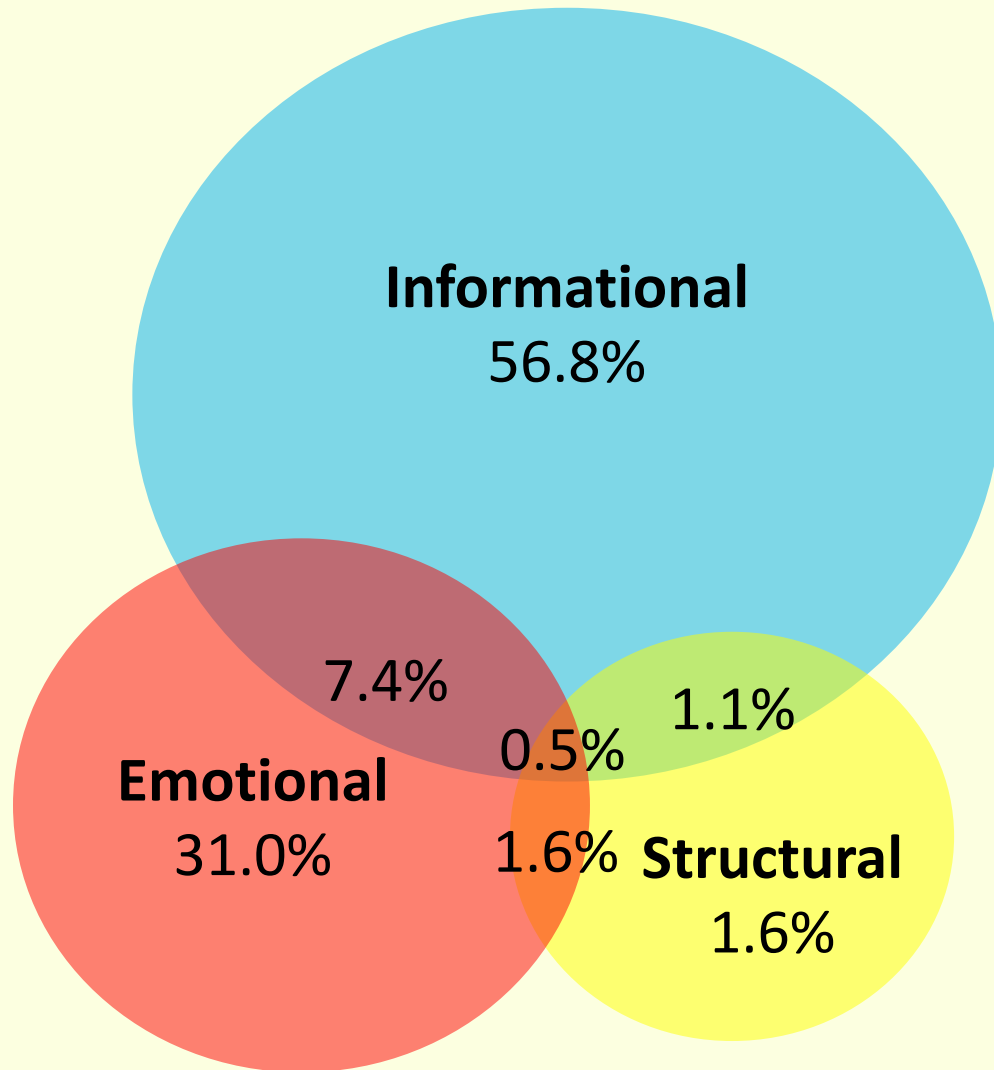

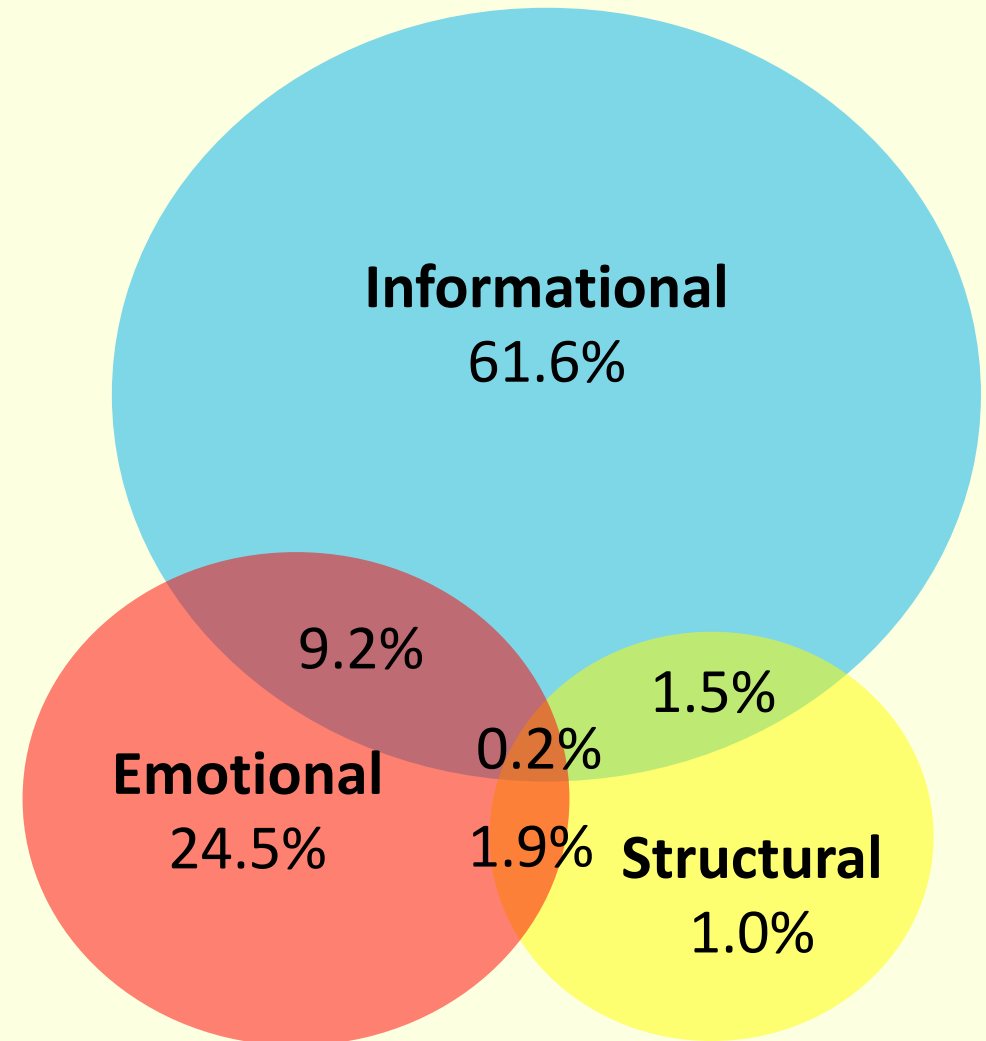

Support Frequencies

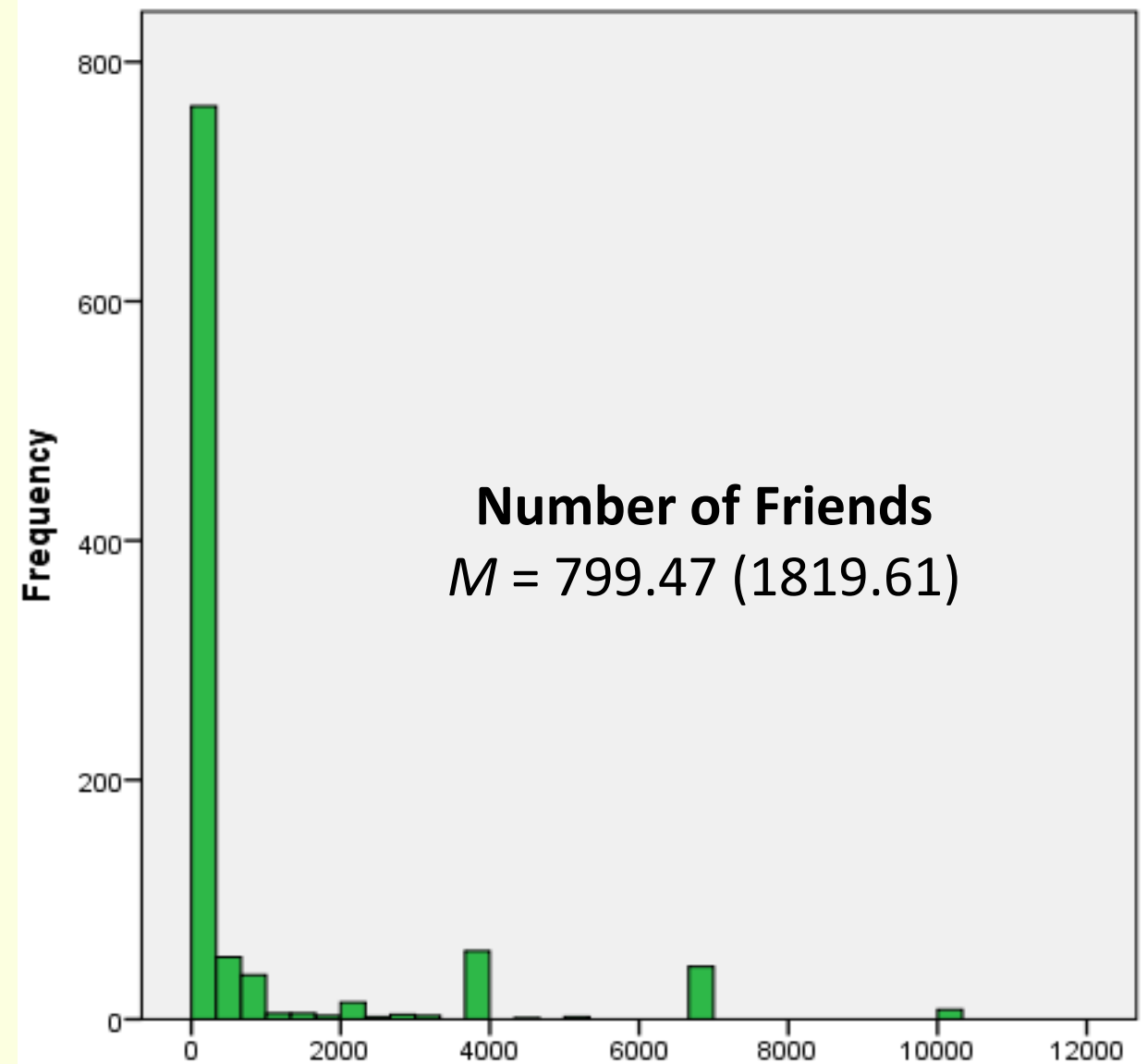
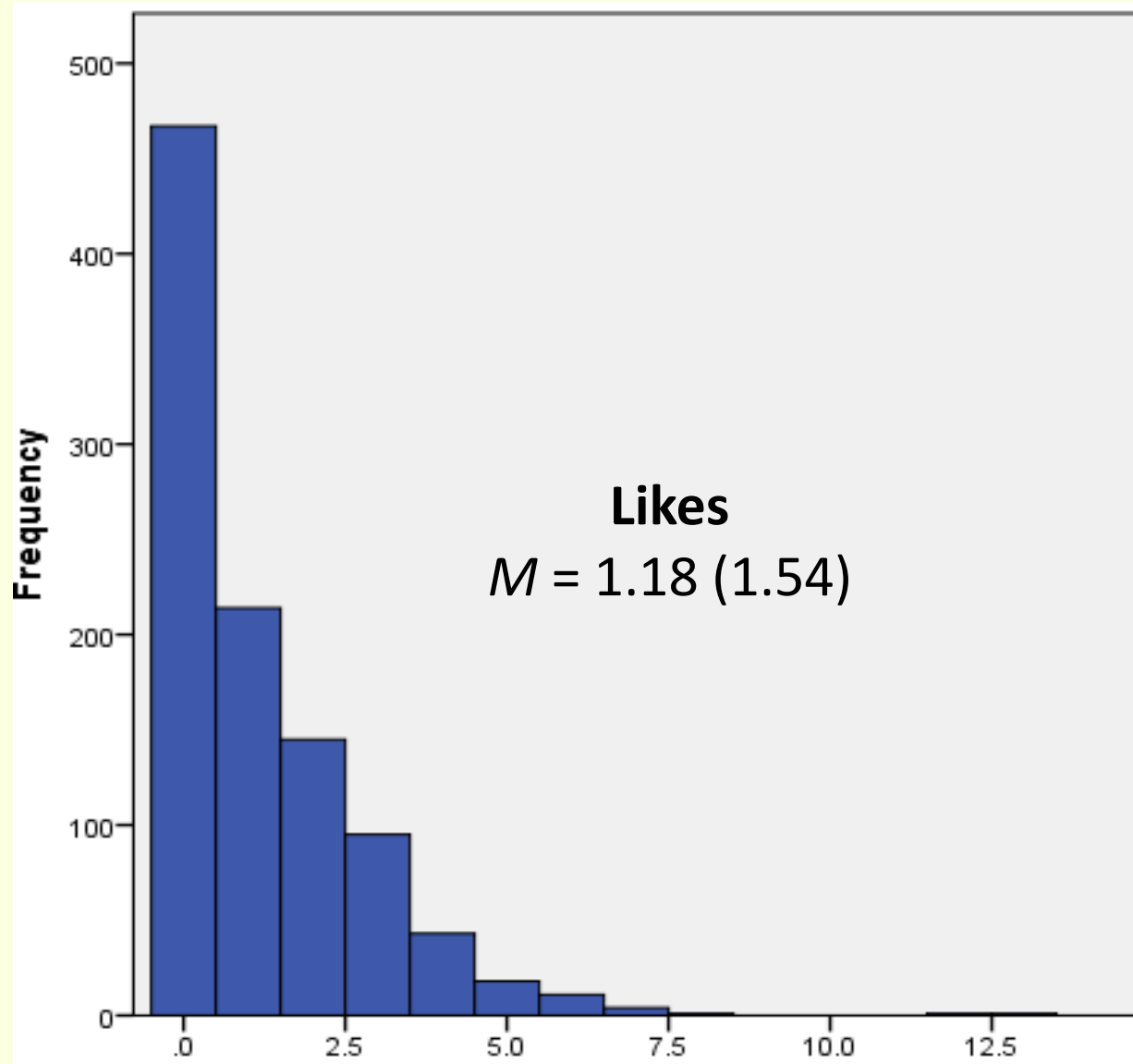
Seeking: 190 posts



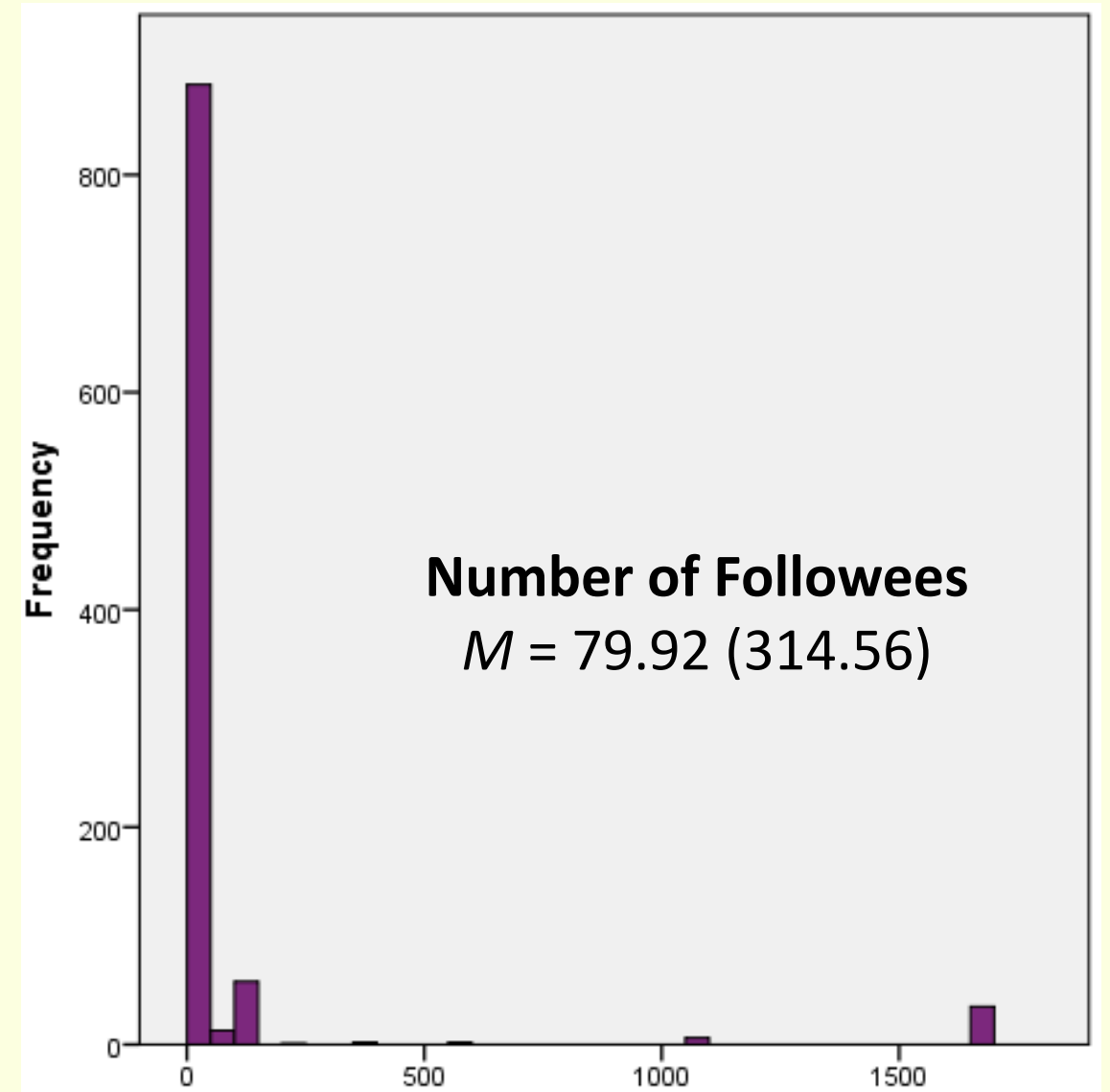
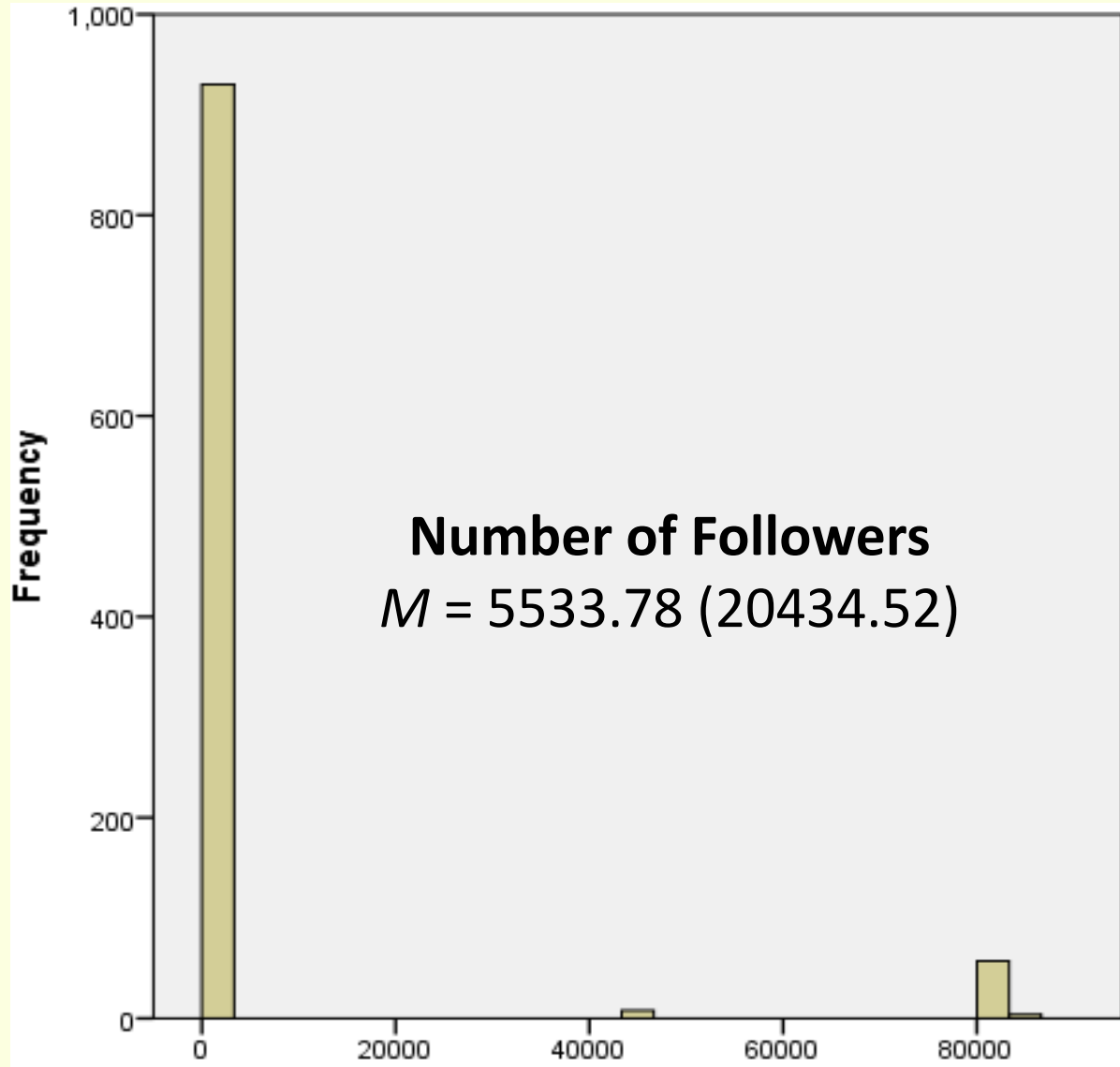
Providing: 477 posts



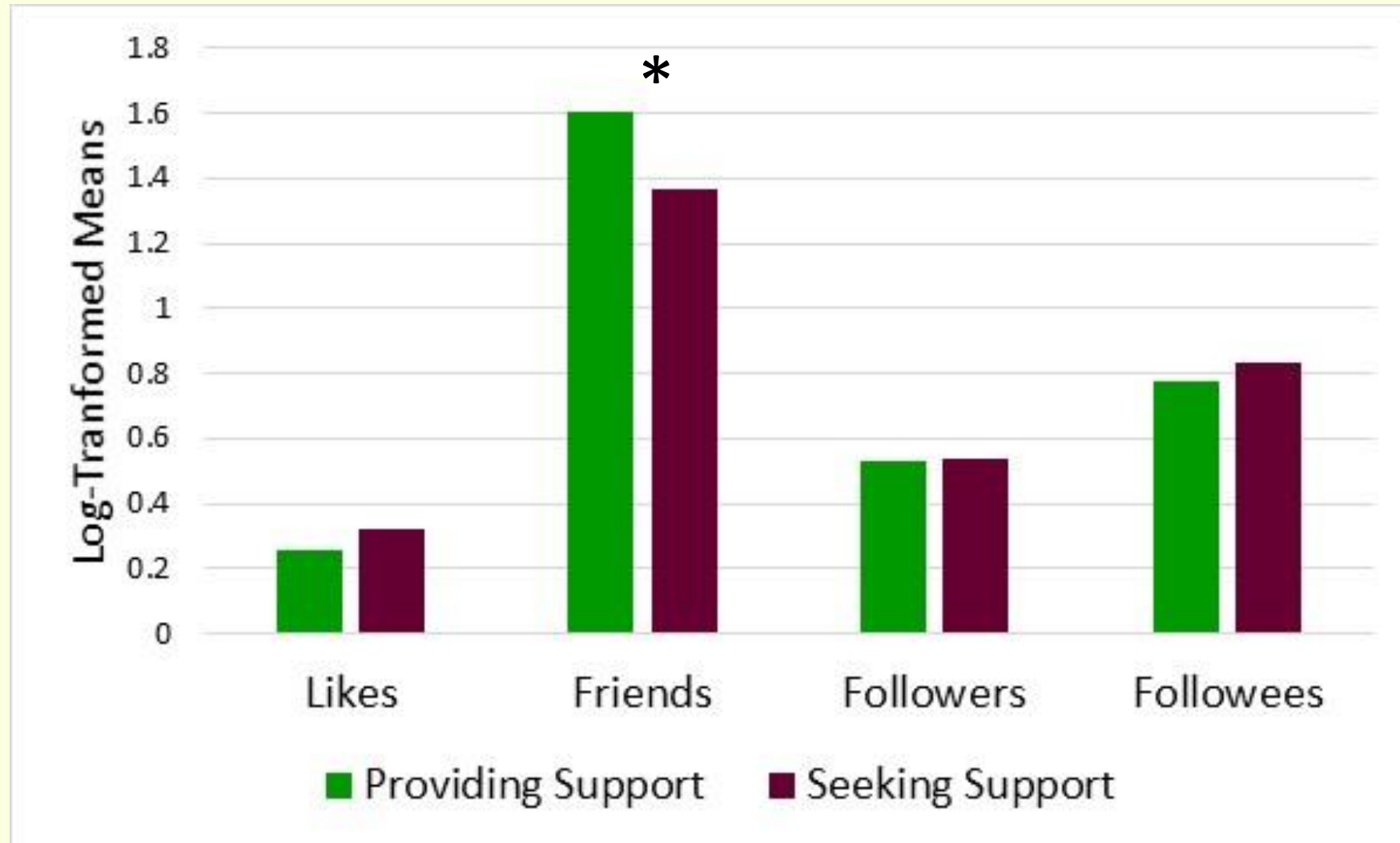
Properties of Posts

Friends: $t(300) = 2.59$; $p = .01$, $d = .31$, 95% CI [.06 - .41]

Future Analyses

For Each User

- Build classifier
- User trajectory over time
 - Start as “seeker” and then “provider”

Inter-relations among users and posts

- Connection formation (friends, followers)
- Flow of classifications (among reply threads, friends)
- Quality of information among social networks

Ultimate goal: Accurate classifier to guide patients
